Monocular depth cues: height in plane, relative size, occlusion and linear perspective.

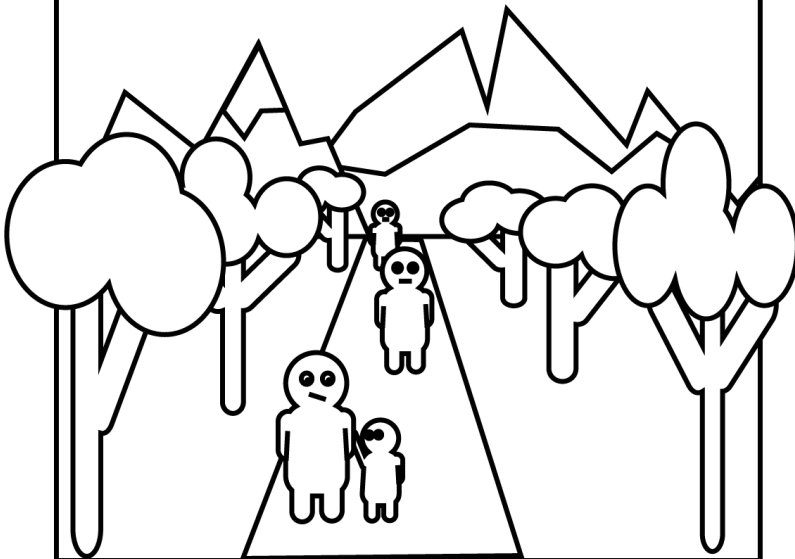
Binocular depth cues: retinal disparity, convergence.
